While rooted in Brazil, its structure and principles are universal, adapting to diverse cultures and realities. The Brazilian Rite: More than a Rite, a Philosophy of Life

The Brazilian Rite emphasizes civic-patriotic, theistic, humanistic, and humanitarian values. Its liturgical-doctrinal structure is composed of 33 interdependent degrees, divided into two segments:

- **Symbolism (Degrees 1-3):** Focused on the fundamental teachings of Freemasonry, such as brotherhood, work and the immortality of the soul, under direct control of symbolic grand bodies.
- Philosophical (degrees 4-33): A journey of improvement that unfolds in stages, from individual mastery to service to the Order, the Fatherland and Humanity.

A significant strength of the Brazilian Rite, as a rite of national culture, is its adaptability. The legends of certain degrees can be adapted to incorporate figures and stories from each jurisdiction. Thus, while maintaining universal elements like grips, signs, and words, each jurisdiction can present the degrees in a way that reflects its national identity.
